'Lean in' to opportunities rather than 'Lean back'

espite the advances in education and opportunity, women still remain under represented in senior leadership positions across the globe. The situation is particularly grim in India.

According to the World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap Report 2013, only five per cent of working women in India have made it to senior leadership positions, much lower than the global average of 20 per cent.

A majority of companies are making gender diversity a priority by setting aspirational goals for inclusion of women in their workforce. For a woman, becoming a leader is not just about being put in that role, or acquiring and adapting new skills and style. It involves shift in her identity, inner will to lead and support structures that encourage her to prioritise work over family.

It is this blend of organisational support and the inherent shift.

Given this backdrop, FICCI Ladies Organisation organised an interactive session with Sheryl Sandberg, COO of Facebook, on the theme 'Lean In: Women, Work and Will to Lead' to deliberate upon issues that can encourage women to pursue their ambitions

In her address, Sandberg stated that three things need to be primarily addressed, in order to bring about a visible difference in the percentage of women participation in workforce and thereby, propelling the economy of the world. This can only be achieved by addressing stereotypes, ensuring equal and fair treatment and achieve balance at home, she stated
