



Kuwarni Ritu Singh was announced as the Founder Chairperson of the new Chapter along with her dynamic team of Office Bearers.


The web event was very well attended, with several dynamic women entrepreneurs and professionals from the new Chapter besides the Presidium, Past Presidents & National Governing Body Members.

Dr Sodhi said that the success of Amul can be attributed to consistency in business structure and philosophy, product recipes and quality, communication, and HR practices.


Talking about the Leadership lessons from Amul, Dr Sodhi highlighted on dedicated, selfless and visionary leadership, highest standards of excellence and innovation.






India's Recovery Post Covid: Role of Tech Industry with Mr Rishad Premji, Chairman, WIPRO | August 24, 2021

Under the National Initiative 2021-22, FLO has undertaken an array of Skilling and Empowerment initiatives though the FLO Village Industries and Transformation (VIT) project. The objective is to transform 44 VIT Villages into Model Villages and introduce at least one industry to empower village women for sustainable livelihood.

Hon'ble Minister Shri Giriraj Singh addressed the session as the Chief Guest at FLO's National Event – Skilling and Empowerment Initiatives through FLO Village Industries and Transformation (VIT) Project on February 15, 2021.

Hon'ble Minister said the government is working towards ensuring that by the end of the year 2022, over 3 crore women will be part of Mission One lakh which will also create opportunities for packaging, branding of their products. "Without improving the lives of people in rural area, we cannot change the real picture of India," he added.

Commenting on the FLO's VIT project, Mr Singh said that FLO must set a goal to set-up 30 million women enterprises by 2030 along with their mentoring. "With this, we can create around 150-170 million jobs. FLO should also support these women entrepreneurs by creating marketing linkages, mentoring, designing along with branding and boost the rural products," he said.

The Interstate meet was even more significant, as FLO Bangalore celebrated 10 years of its existence.








The Past Chairpersons of the Chapter were felicitated and recognized for their contribution in nurturing and growing the Chapter, in a gala event held at Bangalore Palace.




Reminiscing Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel with historian and journalist Dr Hindol Sengupta July 16, 2021

Chapter ReportsFLO Start Up Symposium | March 21, 2022

In the FLO Start Up Symposium organised in New Delhi, NITI Aayog CEO Amitabh Kant said that women-owned businesses will be the next big disruption within the Indian start-up ecosystem.

In October 2021, FICCI Ladies Organisation (FLO) launched a 16-week FLO accelerator program to encourage women-led startups to better heights. Bengaluru-based EcoCollab, co-founded by architects Anamika Garg and Arundhati Sett was declared winner.

As part of FLO accelerator program, a total of 20 startups were shortlisted out of hundreds of the applications that FLO reportedly received. The FLO then had the shortlisted startups to pitch to the angel investors and venture capitalists for funding. After going through 16-weeks of rigorous heat to prove its mettle, EcoCollab, a one-stop platform for 'sustainable buildings' which aims to simplify sustainability with its use of climate responsive designs in the making of sustainable buildings at conventional pricing, emerged as winner. EcoCollab method reportedly works for all building typologies. The startup received a \$5000 AWS gift card and a trophy.

The event includes two panel discussions, one physical and the other, virtual. Panel 1 titled, "Stereotyping: Women in Business & Investing" had Shanti Mohan, Founder, Lets Venture; Shinjini Kumar, Co-Founder SALT and Dinika Bhatia, Founder & CEO, DRB as the panelists.

In the 2nd Panel, "Transition from Startup to Growth: Learnings & Insights", the panellists were Nithin Kamath, Founder & CEO, Zerodha; and Kaushik Mukherjee, Co-Founder & COO, SUGAR Cosmetics; in conversation with Vinayak Burman, Founder and Managing Partner, Vertices Partner.



A CONSOLIDATED REPORT ON THE EVENTS (2021-2022)

In the year 2021-2022, the Northeast Chapter organised 7 webinars and deepened its work on-site, with 20 on-ground events.

Some of the speakers and facilitators were Mr. Karan Kakkad, Anu Ganapathy, Sweta Vyas, Ms. Noa Muzzafi- Yagev from Israel, Dr. Taruna Yaday, Vivek Sadhale, Kashmiri Nath and Dr. Mythili Hazarika.

The OUTCOME

The objective of our webinars was members' and community education

as well as engagement in times which had continued to be uncertain. It was charted out by us at FLO Northeast to harness every opportunity and weave in a balanced bland of digital interface with our members as well as purposeful on-ground activation- which particularly found a deep yearning amongst our members. Our speakers and facilitators brought in perspectives and learnings from across geographies for our members, bringing a quench to curiosity across subjects of mental health, business through the legal lenses, nutrition and health, sustainability, menstrual hygeine etc.

Our on-gound activity primarily tended to members' networking, community skilling at the grassroots, community health support as well as community upliftment through the electrification project. We made an impact in the areas of menstrual hygeine education as well as personality development with spoken English amongst the youth.

Menstrual Hygiene

Speaking of menstrual hygeine, the Radio platform was leveraged for the 1st time in FLO Northeast's history, to reach out to the community at large on the subject of Menstrual Hygiene with a subject matter expert medical practitioner. Moreover sanitary napkins' distribution was undertaken by the chapter in the Kaliabor district. Further a Menstrual Hygeine Awareness Talk was held at Jagiroah HS School with the Amee Baruah Foundation.

FLO Northeast's brand augmentation and visibility

The FLO team, alongwith the Chairperson, Ms. Suruchi Agarwal met with senior dignitaries of our state and central government, to apprise them of the works of FLO Northeast and to bring their attention to areas which could gain momentum towards further development of women in the region. Honourable Union Minister, Sri Sarbananda Sonowal was met with in this regard. The State Chief Minister, Honourable Sri. Himanta Biswa Sarmah was met with to bring forth the possibilities of FLO Northeast's contribution towards the womenfolk of the region. It were these efforts which further felicitated the activation of the menstrual hygeine drive, and the distribution of sanitary napkins, with the grand support of Government of Assam's Honourable Health Minister, Sri. Keshab Mahanta.

The Independence Day was marked with the unveiling of a wall mural near the prestigious Nehru Stadium as a mark of respect towards the region's freedom fighters as well as the Olympics winner, Ms. Lovleena Borgohain. This initiative gave FLO Northeast a physical presence in the public space of the city of Guwahati.

Member's Networking

The FLO members received a unique window through the term, with the digital as well as on-ground activation of the "FLO-preneurs' League". Through this initiative, each member gained a huge mileage for her own brand as well as that of her business and professional ventures. More than 75% of the members came forward to participate in this initiative, thus gaining from the showcase and the same resulting in their individual branding as well as business and progessional gains. This digital showcase was further augmented with an on-ground meet, which brought in immense traction in the members' cross-industry learning as well as business networking.

FLO Northeast ventured for a visit to the state-of-the-art facilities of the EMAMI group's production facilities in the vicinity of Guwahati.

Community Development

The World Environment Day was celebrated with great gusto with the planting of 20,000 Gilor Saplings
